

Climate actions Incentra

Incentra has three employees and rent office space in Oslo. The primary environmental impact from our operations is related to business travel. In addition, there is energy consumption as a tenant, as well as the purchase of electronics and materials for daily operations.

Environmental objectives:

Purchasing and selecting office suppliers / materials:

- Incentra shall seek to use environmental friendly and/or sustainable products
- Incentra shall seek to contribute to efficient and conscious use of energy. Energy use shall be a decision criteria in daily business.

Travel

- Incentra personnel shall make a conscious decision when selecting travel method and schedule; co-driving when practical, use public transport when possible. When flying try to gather as many meetings/audits as possible in one location to reduce number of flights. When possible arrange Teams-meetings instead of travelling.

Waste and recycling

- We separate the company's waste for recycling. All employees shall be given information about waste segregation/recycling.

The largest potential negative footprint in Incentra's purchasing practices is related to the use of the framework agreements we negotiate on behalf of our members. The CO₂ footprint from members' use of the agreements is reflected in Scope 3 of our members' climate accounts, not in our own.

However, there is significant potential for positive influence through:

- Selection and follow-up of suppliers
- Choosing suppliers that manage the entire product lifecycle, including returns and recycling/reuse
- Encouraging partners to reduce emissions and provide emission data at customer level, enabling our customers to measure this in their own Scope 3

We will consider whether to establish a separate climate account for Incentra. Our primary focus will be to follow up on climate reporting within the contracts and the supply chain, where we can make the most impact.
